Vancouver Island, BC, Canada – June 20, 2024: Kenyan credit union leader Winnie Sergon spent 10 days learning the ins and outs of Coastal Community Credit Union.

The visit was courtesy of the Women's Mentorship Program, developed by the Co-operative Development Foundation of Canada. The annual international co-operative mentoring program is a mutual learning opportunity for both Canadian credit unions and female managers of overseas financial co-operatives.

Winnie is head of IT & Innovation at Boresha Sacco Credit Union in Kenya. She spent from June 6th to 15th immersed in the activities of every department of the largest credit union based on Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands.

"The HR department's well-planned program for the period left no stone unturned," said Winnie. "Bravo for the meticulous planning! All my areas of concern were well attended to. Pairing me with the various staff at various times, including Sunday, gave me an opportunity to inquire and learn more, which I really appreciate."
